Engaged Campus Training Grants	Engaged Campus Training Grants (ECTG) fund campus-based professional development opportunities specific to community engagement work for faculty, staff, and students. The ECTG encourages the development of a culture of engagement on individual campuses and encourage collaboration among institutions.	Ongoing
Mountain West Engagement Awards	The Mountain West Engagement Awards recognize the exemplary work of faculty, staff, academic departments, and students within the field of community engagement.	Fall 2016
Newman Civic Fellows	One outstanding student per CCMW member campus is nominated as a Newman Civic Fellow, an award of National Campus Compact. Newman Civic Fellows are highlighted at the regional and national levels through Campus Compact for their dedication and service.	Winter
Service in Action Scholarships	CCMW hosts a photo competition for students to capture "service in action." Students submitted photos of their community-based experiences, either through academic and co-curricular service learning experiences. Public votes via social media determine the top winners of the competition who receive scholarships from CCMW.	Spring
